BEAUTIFUL, ACCESSIBLE, SECURE FLAGSHIP CAMPUS

- A safe and supportive destination for healing
- Secure perimeter with controlled entry/exit
- 24-hour monitoring of 50+ security cameras
- Firearm detection for access to residential units

- 90 emergency/transitional one-bedroom apartments for families
- 45 emergency/transitional double occupancy efficiency units for singles
- Accommodations for 360 adults and children
- A café that provides three free meals and two snacks a day
- A bodega for free goods and sundries for residents

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT RESOURCE AND LEARNING LABS

- 20+ computer workstations for online learning and development

- Multifunctional training room for survivors to learn skills that advance their economic standing and self esteem

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING CENTER

HOUSING AND CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

- Gateway to scattered site, community-based inventory of HAWC subsidized permanent housing for up to 65 households

- Access to trained legal advocates and volunteer attorneys to support survivors' engagement with the civil and criminal justice system
- Forensic interviews
